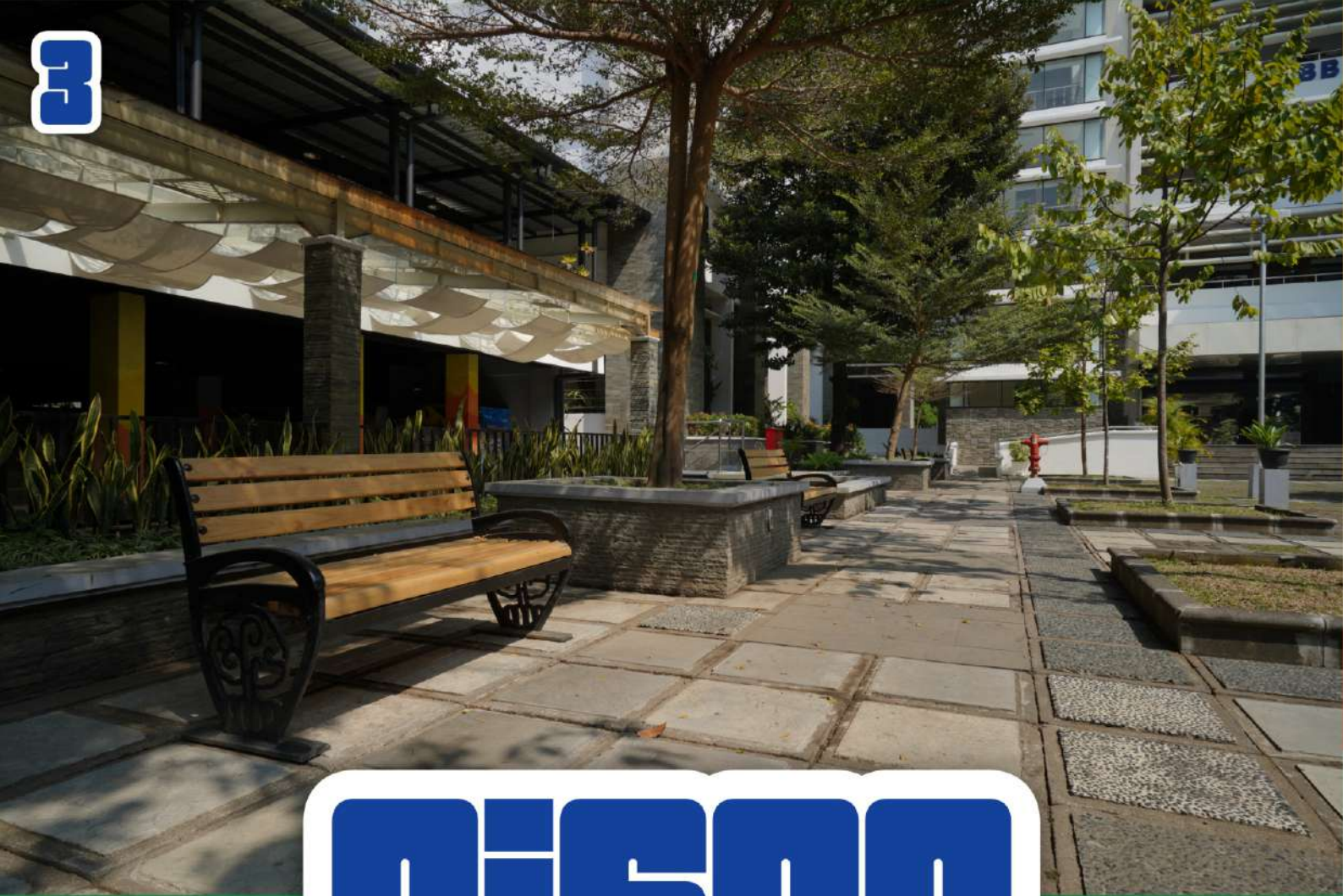

Yogyakarta, located in the heart of Java Island, is the only province in Indonesia that is governed by a monarch. The King, known as Sultan (currently Hamengkubuwono X), serves as the appointed governor of the province.

Renowned as one of the prime tourist destinations in Indonesia, Yogyakarta welcomes visitors with its rich cultural heritage and captivating attractions. The city is rich with traditional and historical values as it is the center of Javanese culture for many centuries. Hence, Yogyakarta is vibrant with classical Javanese fine arts such as batik, wayang puppet show, Ramayana Ballet, and Gamelan. There are also world-famous Hindu & Buddhist temples in Yogyakarta such as: Prambanan and Borobudur (located 1,5 hours away from Yogyakarta). Yogyakarta is also blessed with a wealth of natural beauty; beautiful beaches can be found in the southeastern part of the province, and the world's most active volcanoes, Mount Merapi, lies up in the north.

The people of Yogyakarta are well-known for their hospitality. Their warm greetings, friendliness, and smile are the quintessential of Javanese society. The city is also hailed as the nation's center of education due to its high-quality educational institutions (especially the higher education ones) attract many students and artists alike. Lecture Information

Course List and Description:

In this short course, there are six intensive courses that are designed to give students a broad understanding of some of the contemporary issues that Indonesia faces as the result of the digital transformation. Each course will take 4 hours, and the total contact hours for all lecture series are 24 hours.

Course: Gig Economy in Indonesia: Practice and Challenges

In the era of digital disruption and economic transformation, the gig economy has emerged as a dynamic and transformative force, significantly impacting the employment landscape. This course, "Gig Economy in Indonesia: Practice and Challenges," invites participants into an immersive exploration of the intricate dynamics, practices, and socio-economic implications of gig work in the Indonesian context. The course delves into the evolution of gig work, the ecosystem of gig platforms, the legal and regulatory frameworks governing this sector, and the nuanced challenges faced by gig workers and the broader society.



Course: The Rise of Gaming Industries in Indonesia

Over the past few years, Indonesia's gaming industry has grown and developed substantially, with a report from Steam showing that Indonesian gaming publishers have published around 256 games on the Steam platform (the most in Southeast Asia). Furthermore, Indonesia has also seen the rapid rise of its eSports scene, in which the industry was valued at approximately 9.73 million USD, making it one of the fastest-growing eSports markets in the world. In this course, we will learn more about the development of the gaming industry in Indonesia, some of its key issues, and its effect on Indonesia's national economy.



Course: Indonesia's Democracy in the Digital Age

As one of the world's largest democracies, Indonesia presents a compelling case study for understanding the impact of digital platforms, social media, and online discourse on political processes, civic engagement, and governance. This course delves into the complexities of Indonesia's political landscape, examining how digital technologies have reshaped the dynamics of citizen participation, political communication, and electoral processes, especially during the 2024 General Election, which saw the massive utilisation of digital technology in its campaign.



Course: Op-Ed Writing Workshop

In this engaging workshop, participants will learn how to write an opinion-editorial (Op-Ed) article covering social and political issues, both on the Indonesian context and internationally. The workshop culminates in a polished op-ed draft as your final summer course assignment. The best student submissions will be encouraged to apply for publication in the FISIPOL UGM Megashift website, amplifying your voice and increasing your personal portfolio of publications.



Course: Gender and Social Inclusion in Indonesia

Indonesia has seen rising momentum on addressing gender and social inclusion, including with the recent Sexual Violence Crimes Law (UU TPKS). However, women and minority groups still find structural barriers and challenges, especially with the rise of new issues, such as online gender violence. This course dives into persisting challenges around equitable participation, barriers faced by vulnerable communities, and the dangers of digital marginalization in Indonesia's technology-driven landscape. Students will evaluate policies and social innovation opportunities to foster safe digital access ensuring no one is left behind.

Course: Understanding Cultural Diversity and Ethnicity in Indonesia

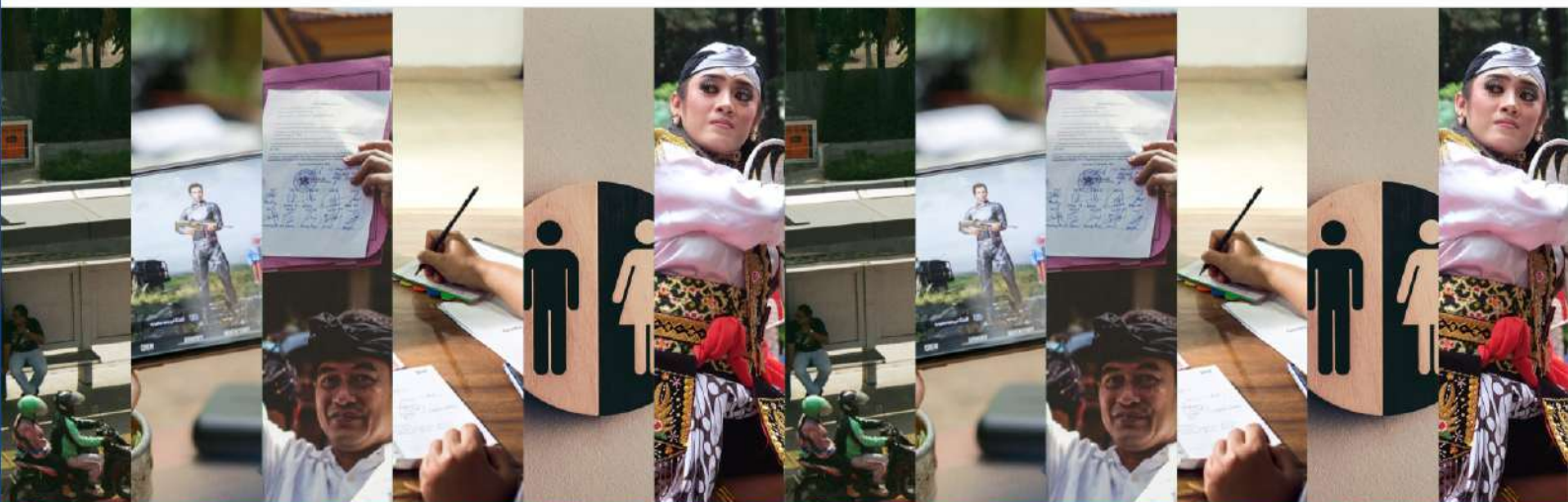

How To Reach Yogyakarta

Flight

Yogyakarta International Airport is well connected with daily flights from Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Jakarta, Surabaya, and Bali to Yogyakarta International Airport. Upon arrival, you can easily reach the city center by taking the airport train with fares ranging from Rp 20,000 to Rp 50,000.

Train

There is a regular train service between Yogyakarta and other neighboring major cities. For instance, an executive class train from Jakarta (Stasiun Gambir) to Yogyakarta (Stasiun Yogyakarta) costs approximately Rp500,000-Rp600,000, while premium economy class train from Jakarta (Stasiun Pasar Senen) to Yogyakarta (Stasiun Lempuyangan) ranges from Rp230,000-Rp350,000

Both flight and train tickets can be conveniently purchased through Traveloka, Agoda or other Online Travel Sites.

Transportation in Yogyakarta

- Transportation will be provided from the UGM to the cultural excursion places. The bus departs only once each time
- There are several means of public transportation to get around Yogyakarta ranging from the traditional ones such as becak (a pedicab) to the modern ones such as bus and online transportations.
- One of the most popular public transportation means for both the domestic & international students in Yogyakarta are Gojek and Grab which are online transportation apps for cars and motorcycles. You can download the application from Google Play or App Store and use it to call the drivers for taking you to your destination.
- Cost of Grab or Go-Jek
- If you leave nearby UGM, for example 7 mins away from UGM, it will cost you approximately Rp 13,000 (motorbike) and Rp 26,000 (car)



Culinary in Yogyakarta

Indonesian people typically eat rice with its side dishes three times a day. Since Indonesian food mainly uses a lot of spices, it has a rich and often spicy taste. Many Javanese people (fyi, Javanese is the local ethnicity in Yogyakarta), especially in Yogyakarta like to have a sweet taste in their food and drink. Hence, most beverages in Yogyakarta contain a considerable amount of sugar. If you do not want your drink to be too sweet, you can order it with less sugar (sedikit gula) or no sugar (tanpa gula). Most restaurants are halal (muslim-friendly food), but some of them are also non-halal.

Yogyakarta has a lot of nice restaurants with prices ranging from high-class to student friendly. Therefore, we will offer you some must-visit places to eat and hang-out!

Yogya Gokart

Find and prove a gokart with 4 stroke power, 350 cc and a power up to 8.4 hp / 3600 rpm, very steady driven by anyone who wants to test the adrenaline and courage themselves. Yogya Gokart has a total of 30 karts divided into 8 units of Gokart Eagle (for single), 8 Units of Gokart Double (for double) and 6 units Gokart talon for children aged 6-12 years and 8 Units Gokart Pro. With the facility of a professional karting lap time system, now the drivers will get a printout of the fastest lap speed so the drivers can find out how tough they play the gokart.

Prambanan Temple

Built in the 10th century, this is the largest temple compound dedicated to Shiva in Indonesia. Rising above the center of the last of these concentric squares are three temples decorated with reliefs illustrating the epic of the Ramayana, dedicated to the three great Hindu divinities (Shiva, Vishnu and Brahma) and three temples dedicated to the animals who serve them.





Taman Sari Water Castle

Taman Sari is a garden site of the Sultan's palace which was used by the Sultan in the past for leisure. Located near the Sultan's Palace, it is open every day from 08.00 until 14.00.

Yogyakarta Tugu Monument

This is the symbol of Yogyakarta and was built one year after the establishment of the Yogyakarta Kingdom back in the 18th century. The current Tugu had been rebuilt several times in the past due to the damages inflicted by powerful earthquakes. Come nighttime, the monument is often surrounded by youngsters and tourists!

Malioboro Street

Yogyakarta's most famous & crowded shopping street. It can be reached in 20 minutes using online car or motorbike transportation..

Beringharjo Traditional Market

Located in the southern end of Malioboro Street, Beringharjo is a center for Batik shopping. With good bargaining skills, you can buy Batik for a reasonable price. There are also many more things other than Batik being sold at Beringharjo. The Beringharjo Traditional Market can be reached in 20 minutes using online car or motorbike transportation.

Hamzah Batik

A one-stop shopping place for Javanese souvenirs. The store has a fixed price so you cannot bargain, but it is quite reasonable with premium quality. A highly recommended place for souvenir shopping. The place opens from 09.00 until 01.00. Located at the southern end of Malioboro.





Borobudur Temple

Located 2 hours away from UGM, this famous Buddhist temple, dating from the 8th and 9th centuries, is located in central Java. It was built in three tiers: a pyramidal base with five concentric square terraces, the trunk of a cone with three circular platforms and, at the top, a monumental stupa. The walls and balustrades are decorated with fine low reliefs, covering a total surface area of 2,500 m². Around the circular platforms are 72 openwork stupas, each containing a statue of the Buddha. The monument was restored with UNESCO's help in the 1970s.



Hospitality

Yogyakarta is known as a student-friendly city, for both local and international students. There are many exchange students spread in several universities here.
